### **Presentation Summary:**

Amanda Scott provided an update on plans for the Fall Annual Program Meeting, including updates on registration and housing deadlines, program development and timing of administrative, leadership and group meetings.

# Advancing Dissemination and Implementation Sciences Working Group Report Out (Slides 9-16)

Speakers: Kathleen Stevens, Reza Yousefi-Nooraie, Jonathan Tobin

### Presentation Summary:

Kathleen Stevens, Jonathan Tobin, and Reza Yousefi-Nooraie discussed the progress and goals of the Advancing Dissemination and Implementation Sciences Working Group. They highlighted the group's efforts to align with current agency priorities, the increase in membership and engagement, and the development of various deliverables, including case presentations and surveys to understand the collaboration between Practice-Based Research Networks (PBRNs) and CTSA hubs.

### Key Questions & Responses:

- Q (Ted Wun): How many competencies were initially identified, and how many were narrowed down?
   A (Reza Yousefi-Nooraie): Initially there were 350 competencies, which were narrowed down to 50.
- Q (David Ingbar): Could we encourage groups to have expert competencies and training-level competencies that are broader and less deep?
   A (Jonathan Tobin): Jonathan Tobin acknowledged the need for different levels of competencies for implementation science researchers, implementers, and those in training.
- Q (Vesna Garovic): What is the structure of practice-based research networks in terms of their relationship to NCATS and hubs?
   A (Kathleen Stevens and Jonathan Tobin): Kathleen Stevens and Jonathan Tobin explained the history and structure of practice-based research networks, emphasizing the importance of bottom-up and top-down approaches.

IDLEs Survey: Engaging Individuals with Disability in the Research Process WG (Slides 17-18)

### **Presentation Summary:**

Amanda Scott provided an overview of the IDLEs Toolkit Survey that committee members had received for review prior to the meeting. Committee members provided feedback and concluded that more information was needed in order to confidently endorse the survey.
