Welcome and Announcements (Slides 3-4)

BIDS (Slides 5-6)

Presentation summary:

M. Kurilla announced the SC unanimously decided at its November 13 meeting to rename the Informatics Enterprise Committee (iEC) to **B**io**s**tatics, **I**nformatics, and **D**ata **S**cience (BIDS EC) to be more inclusive for biostatistics and data science research. The current EC leadership will modify strategy and communication language to reflect this change going forward. The CTSA will widely disseminate notice of the name change and will invite new members to join the EC to make it more representative of the enhanced focus.

SC EC Liaisons (Slide 5)

Presentation summary:

M. Kurilla explained there will be a change to the membership of the SC for 2025. Each EC Lead Team will select a representative from their Lead Team to serve as a voting member of the SC in 2025. This will help ensure a broad range of subject matter experts are included in making decisions about CTSA program activities. Lead Team selections are due December 13. An onboarding meeting will be held in early January.

WG Proposal Topic Survey (Slide 6)

Presentation summary:

M. Kurilla noted SC members will receive a survey this week asking for recommended Key Topic Areas of Interest, around which new Working Group (WG) proposals for 2025 will focus. The slides displayed the following current list of suggested topics:

- Learning health and research systems
- Best practices for navigating the Science of Translation
- Causes of rising midlife mortality in America (Case & Deaton, PNAS, 2015)
- Climate change and health
- National training curricula in CTS
- Diversity, equity, inclusion and accessibility
- Enhancing the impact of clinical trials
- Artificial Intelligence

WG Proposal Discussion & Voting (Slides 7-48)

Speakers: Michael Kurilla, Ruth O'Hara, and Cindy Mark

Presentation Summary:

C. Mark led the SC in a vote on which of nine WG proposals submitted under Cycle XIII to approve. She shared the current list of WGs and noted two WGs will sunset at the end of 2024, and another five will sunset in June 2025. She explained the voting process, which was conducted via the PollEv.com online polling platform, and directed anyone with a conflict of interest to abstain from voting on a particular proposal. M. Kurilla explained members should consider the merits of each proposal separately and not compare them. If more than three are approved, the SC can prioritize which WGs will begin in January versus later in 2025.

C. Mark began by sharing three slides for each proposal displaying goals and deliverables; visualizations demonstrating recommendations, feedback, and scores provided during the SC's review in October and November; and a summary of positive comments and constructive criticism provided during the review. She then invited discussion before sending out a poll by which members officially voted to select three new WGs to begin operating in January 2025. Summary information about each proposal is below.

Nine proposals were reviewed and voted upon. Three proposals were chosen:

- Catalyzing Impact on Health and Health Care through Effective Partnerships with Learning Health Systems
- Translational Case Studies in Commercialization
- Overcoming Barriers in Women's Health Research

All proposal writers were notified by CCOS on December 16, 2024. Constructive criticism and positive comments were provided, as well as requests to revise and re-submit, if appropriate.

Words of Wisdom from Departing SC Members (Slides 49-53)

K. Sandberg noted she has been involved with many NIH institutes, and NCATS is her favorite because of its collaborative nature.

J. Meinzen-Derr shared how much she appreciated the open communication and sharing of knowledge among CTSA participants.

J. Kraschnewski challenged members to regularly provide SC updates to Pods to leverage collaboration.

R. Urban seconded the importance of Pod meetings and for SC members to help provide structure for those meetings. He noted Pods work with administrators to solve many problems.

D. Mitchell has appreciated the collegiality of operations in the CTSA program and commended NCATS. He urges SC members to continue being accessible to and communicating with CTSAAs to encourage open dialogue and sharing of perspectives.
